

- ✓ Download and extract a ZIP file
- ✓ Create folder
- ✓ Move files
- 1. Extract the compressed folder *instrumente* (instrumente.zip).

  Right-click on *instrumente.zip* and select the command *Extract all* from the context menu.
- 2. Create four new folders in the **instrumente** folder (not instrumente.zip!):

Wind instruments

String instruments

**Percussion instruments** 

**Keyboard** instruments

Open the **instrumente** folder, right-click in the empty area. Select  $New \rightarrow Folder$  and enter the folder names.

- 3. Set the folder view so that the musical instruments are displayed as images.
  - → Click in the empty area with the right mouse button,
  - $\rightarrow$  select **View**  $\rightarrow$  **Large icons** from the context menu.
- 4. Move the images to the appropriate folders:
  - $\rightarrow$  click on an instrument (e. g. althorn.jpg) with the right mouse button
  - → select **Cut**
  - → open the correct folder (e. g. wind instruments)
  - → right-click in the empty folder
  - → select **Paste**
  - → to get back press the backspace key (above the enter key)
- 5. There are other ways to move files (here images). We want to practice this:
  - 1. Delete the folder *instrumente* and extract the compressed folder *instrumente* again. Create the corresponding folders as described in point 2.
    - Move the files in the following way:
    - Click on the image and move it to the correct folder with the mouse.
  - 2. Delete the folder instrumente and extract the compressed folder instrumente.

Use the professional procedure this time:

Key combination Ctrl + x to cut, change to the appropriate folder and use the key combination Ctrl + v to paste.

**X** stands for the scissors  $\mathcal{X}$  and the **V** for the correction character (where something needs to be inserted).

You have now done the exercise three times. Which method was the fastest?
